EGG IN THIS SEASON TO BE

A POWERFUL ONE...





AS SURE AS EGGS IS EGGS... If you want a controversial topic of conversation which steers away from politics and sport in the coming weeks, then why not ask a gathered group why we have eggs at Easter.

Opinions will probably include the

idea that it is an ancient pagan practice pinched by Christians to that the idea primarily a it is marketing exercise by manufacturers

of cocoa-based goods. Other ideas may include that it is something to do with the Trinity, that the ega represents the stone that was rolled away from the tomb, and the fact people didn't eat eggs during Lent and so feasted on them at Faster.

There is probably some truth in all of these. People have given one another eggs to mark the beginning of the Spring season for millennia engraved ostrich eggs have been found in Africa which are 60,000 years old! Throughout the ancient Near East eggs were associated with death and rebirth and very early on Christians in the area picked up the significance of this symbolism for the message of Easter and the practice of decorating eggs spread

gradually from the church in the East to the church in the West (although they weren't chocolate in the UK until 1873).

Whatever the exact details of eags becoming associated with the Easter story, I find the imagery of an egg in this season to be a powerful one. Each fertilised egg, while looking stone like and lifeless on the outside, hides within it the awesome potential for new life.



#### Sondes Place Farm planning application

With the MVDC Local Plan currently paused to allow for a central government consultation on changes to the National Planning Framework include which may removing Green Belt land from development consideration, we were surprised to discover that Gleeson Land have gone ahead regardless and submitted an outline planning application for Sondes Place Farm which is currently green belt farm land adjacent to the A25 in between Westcott and Dorking. The Gleeson Land application, currently with all matters reserved except for access to the highways, is to develop 144 homes, gypsy and traveller pitches and a school drop off.



The WVA strongly objects to this application not least because we consider highly valued it

belt land which helps separate the of Westcott developments Dorking. We have submitted an objection letter to MVDC Planning and would urge all Westcott residents to do the same. It is important the letters are focused on planning policy as that is the framework MVDC will be reviewing the application against. Our letter has been published on the WVA website and attendees at our last WVA Open Meeting on the 15th March also had an opportunity to sign a petition registering their objection to the application.





### WESTCOTT HISTORY GROUP



John Evelyn of Wotton 1620 – 1706 and family life in 17th Century England.



John Evelyn was the fourth child of Richard and Eleanor Evelyn who lived at Wotton. His

siblings were George, Jane, Elizabeth and Richard. They lived through some tumultuous years: Charles I's beheading in 1649, Civil War and Cromwell's protectorate, Charles II's exile until his restoration in 1660, his death in 1685, the recurring Plague and the Fire of London in 1666 and the intermittent war with the Dutch.

The Evelyns were lucky to be in a relatively secure position, being the sole legal producer of gunpowder for the King until 1641. Even after that, their gun powder mills at Wotton and Chilworth on the River Tillingbourne continued to supply the government and the East India Company for many years. Richard Evelyn purchased the Manor of Westcott including Wotton in 1628 and became the High Sheriff of Surrey and Sussex.

John was born at Wotton House on 31st October 1620, and following the custom of using wet nurses, he was put to be nursed by a tenant's wife for over a year. One of his earliest memories was of learning his letters in Wotton Church porch but at the age of five he was sent to be brought up by his maternal grandfather who lived on the outskirts of Lewes, Sussex to avoid the dangers of the Plague. When his grandfather died two years later, John remained with his grandmother, learning Latin and writing from a Huguenot refugee until he became a pupil at Southover Free school. His mother wanted him to go to Eton but, terrified by reports of the school's severity, he pleaded to remain at Southover.

In 1634 his older sister Jane died after giving birth to her first child. John's mother was so devastated that she died the following autumn. John's belief that her inconsolable grief was largely responsible for her death bred in him a fear of uncontrolled emotion which stayed with him always.

The Evelyn brothers were entered for The Middle Temple to acquire the legal knowledge necessary for a country gentleman. In 1637 John went to Balliol College left in 1640 without taking a degree. Sadly his father died at the end of that year and on 2nd January he was buried by night, as was the family custom. The estate accordingly passed to John's elder brother, George. After witnessing the execution in 1641 of the Earl of Strafford, a Royalist, John had no wish

to be involved in politics and decided to travel in Europe, going first to Rome.



In 1641 he returned home briefly to celebrate his 21st birthday with his family and built a fishpond and a study in the garden at Wotton, (see his personal sketch above) but to avoid signing an obligatory Covenant which meant supporting the parliamentary forces he returned to Europe in 1643. After Italy he moved to Paris where he stayed with Richard Browne, the British Ambassador, and met his daughter



Mary Browne whom John married in 1647, though they did not live together for some years as she was considered too young.

After some time spent visiting St Germain and Versailles he returned to England. In 1649 Charles I was executed and John was very disturbed. He spent much of his time at Sayes Court in Deptford, his wife's family home on the south bank of the

Thames. He loved the gardens there but when the house was confiscated by the Parliamentarians he returned to France and his now adult wife Mary. By now 31, he was tired of the nomadic life, so he left Mary in Paris while he returned home to assess the situation.

It was a sad homecoming - his second sister had just died in childbirth, he found the English devoid of courtesy and culture, and the appointment of Puritan ministers to many parishes made Anglican worship difficult. However, he was able to regain possession of Sayes Court when the Act of Oblivion cancelled 'oaths of loyalty' to the new regime and bought an adjoining 100 acres to extend the garden.

Mary and her mother returned to England safely despite the ongoing war with Holland at that time. John and Mary's first son was born at Sayes Court but a month later Lady Browne died of scarlet fever. To divert Mary from her grief John took her for the first time to Wotton and also Albury Park, dining at the Red Lion Inn in Guildford. A second son survived for only 3 months – death in infancy was an accepted event in the 17th century but John and Mary were never reconciled to it.

With Richard Cromwell (Oliver had died in 1658) as Lord Protector, landowners such as the Evelyns prospered. At Sayes Court John planted a garden



famous for its flowers, trees and shrubs, fruit and hothouses and advised his brother, George, on laying out the garden at Wotton in the Italian style with parterres and terraces. John was now considered an expert and was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society for which he wrote a book *Sylva – or a Discourse of Forest Trees* on planting and preservation of timber for the Navy. Having lost yet another child he turned again to literature, writing *The Gardener's Almanack*.

In 1660 the Generals had brought King Charles II back to England and John went to London to watch the King's parade on his return. The next year brought further war with the Dutch and John was involved as a Commissioner with the care of the sick, wounded and prisoners of war. When the plague arrived in London in 1665, John took his wife, Mary and her only surviving son to Wotton and returned to Sayes Court.

The King asked John and Sir Christopher



Wren to join a commission to oversee repairs to St Pauls Cathedral, but on 2nd Sept 1666 the Great Fire of London started and John could see the flames burning day and night from Sayes Court. The fire was visible from 10 miles away and the Cathedral and much of London were reduced to smoking ruins.

In 1672, the Dutch fleet entered the Thames estuary for the third time and John again found himself responsible for organising the 'sick and wounded'. Finally the war ended and the King's niece married William of Orange. John and Christopher Wren were next given the job of building the Greenwich Royal Hospital. When the Czar of Russia, Peter the Great, came to visit to see how the English Navy built their ships John let him and his entourage live in his house at Sayes Court, but the Czar ruined it. John was compensated by the English government.

John's brother George died in 1700 and John, by now 80, and Mary returned to live at Wotton, where John wrote his book *Memories for my Garden*. By now their son and daughter had died but their grandson survived. John Evelyn died in 1706 aged 86 and his wife, Mary died 3 years later at 80 years old.

# MUSIC IN DORKING

The big event of April is the Leith Hill Music Festival, with two days of competitions and concerts. The participating choirs, from towns and villages around Dorking, compete in the morning sessions from 9am and you are very welcome to attend these. Following an afternoon rehearsal with Jonathan Willcocks, the festival conductor, they join forces for an evening concert with full orchestra and soloists. This year the music for the concerts celebrates Elgar, with his Sea pictures and The music makers, and Vaughan Williams, with The Lark Ascending and Toward the unknown region. There is also music by Handel, Haydn and Cecelia McDowall.

Another major event is a visit by the London-based Philharmonia Orchestra, arranged by the Dorking Concertgoers. Their programme includes Dvořák's gorgeously melodic cello concerto and Brahms's monumental first symphony. It opens with Vaughan Williams's Five variants of Dives and Lazarus, showing the composer's love of English folk tunes. If you were expecting this concert in May, please note that the date has been changed owing to a clash with a certain royal coronation!

Also for the Dorking Concertgoers, the Carducci string quartet will give the last in its series of three concerts. The concert begins with Mozart's 'Hunt' quartet and ends with Dvořák's delightful 'American' quartet. The centrepiece is Shostakovich's eighth quartet, a deeply personal work in which he mourns the devastation of the second world war.

The Brockham Choral Society, conducted by Cole Bendall, will be singing Ethel Smyth's rarely-heard Mass in D. There will also be music by Vaughan Williams – Toward the unknown region – and Britten's A hymn to the virgin. Tickets are £20 on the day but only £16 if bought in advance.

Mozart's opera The Marriage of Figaro will be screened live at the Dorking Halls, in a production from the Royal Opera House. This comic masterpiece relates the events of a day in the household of Count Almaviva as his servants Figaro and Susanna prepare for their wedding.

# DORKING AND DISTRICT RSPB



Many forms of wildlife watching involve a degree of discomfort – Arctic cold, tropical humidity, windswept headlands or small boats in choppy seas. At this season, however, we can enjoy one of the world's best wildlife experiences while still in bed, without even opening our eyelids. Even in cities, but certainly in our area rich in mature gardens with shrubs and trees, the dawn chorus reaches its peak in May. Lie back and enjoy the outpouring of music from many different species as the curtains slowly brighten with the increasing light.

As the breeding season hots up, male birdsong reaches its zenith because the territory for food-gathering must be protected. For many species, strong musical performance also offers the opportunity for liaisons with willing females. Almost all birds sing as the day gets light. This proclaims "I've survived the night and this is still my patch." For many migrants such as the warblers, the males arrive first to set up territories, so the dawn chorus provides the first point of contact for prospective pairs. It is worth getting up in the dark (around 4am) at least once in May to enjoy the full benefit of the experience outdoors. Wear a fleece, take a plastic bag and a cushion to sit on, settle quietly and wait.



The tawny owl hoots as it retires to its daytime roost in a large tree after a night of hunting. Not long after, a robin begins to sing. Then every robin within earshot competes. Blackbirds soon join in with their melodies. Robins and blackbirds have large pupils and so see more at dawn and dusk than most garden birds. The chaffinches, the pigeons

and doves are heard next. Then the others join the chorus in rapid succession. The dawn chorus is an experience, not a tutorial, so don't expect to learn to identify birdsong during the dawn chorus. Lots of individuals of every species are all singing at once in a glorious cacophony.

RSPB Dorking & District are holding a dawn chorus walk for International Dawn Chorus Day on Sunday 7th May at Bookham Commons. # **GREEN WESTCOTT**



#### Calling for clean water!



Last month I joined 'March The Mole' – a series of walks which brought together people from the local area united in concern over the poor state of our local river. Rivers are the lifeblood of our country. Freshwater ecosystems are an important habitat and when rivers are healthy they are host to an incredible range of biodiversity, including water voles, mayflies, brown trout and kingfishers. Yet there are no longer any rivers in England that are in a good overall state of health.



The River Mole is no exception. A 2022 report from Planet Patrol found that the River Mole was amongst the worst for water quality. Weak

government policy and regulatory neglect has led to the widespread pollution. Water companies' failure to invest in updating critical sewage infrastructure and run off from agriculture, containing pesticides and fertilisers, are the major sources of contamination. In 2021 alone, the sewer storm overflow in Dorking spilled 64 times into the Mole for a total of 613 hours (The Rivers Trust). These storm overflows were intended to only operate in "exceptional situations" only, but the number of incidents suggest this mechanism is being used more generally. After a sprinkling of snow at the beginning of March, Thames Water's Dorking treatment

plant's storm overflow released raw sewage into the River Mole for over 5 hours.



Along the route from Leatherhead to the Stepping Stones, we met many people who visit the river regularly and expressed their concerns over poor water quality and the impact on wildlife. One fisherman had been fishing the River Mole since childhood and observed first hand the decline in fish and water levels over the years.

On the walk I had many interesting conversations with people from various groups calling for action on this issue and undertaking projects,



# HOMES FOR UKRAINE





Mole Valley has opened its arms with huge generosity over the last year and welcomed over 160 Ukrainian families, over 250 individuals, to the District under the Homes for Ukraine scheme. None of this would have been possible without the hospitality of a large number of hosts who have provided homes and safe havens for those fleeing the conflict.

Single people and families are being hosted across the District from north to south and everywhere in between, children have been welcomed into schools and colleges and families into our communities.
