

Group was started with the support of Holy Trinity Church back in 2005, so has been meeting in Westcott for 18 years this year! For its coming of age, I thought it was time to celebrate this wonderful group, and the dedicated leaders and helpers who make it all happen.

Since it began, hundreds of babies and pre-school children have come through the doors and those first children, toddling around the hall, are now taking their first steps into adult life, getting stuck into the world of work, university, new adventures. Through the years, the purpose of the group has remained the same, to provide a warm, welcomina

home-from-home space for parents, grandparents, carers and the young children in their care. There will always be good coffee, a selection of teas and soft drinks, and, of course, a plentiful supply of cookies (and healthier snacks)!

After covid restrictions put a stop to meeting, the group re-started last summer, under the leadership of Ali Mabley, with help from Audrey, Ian, Jen, Natalie, Libby and Kate. Each week, toys are chosen and put out, kettles and coffee machines switched on and sofas

> and cushions plumped up, in readiness for Dads, Mums, grandparents, carers and children. There's usually a craft

time for little hands to enjoy making and creating, and the morning ends with a joyful song time, not forgetting to celebrate any birthdays that have happened in the week.

I asked Audrey, a volunteer, how she helps on Thursdays – she told me that she 'just' does the washing up and makes sure that there are enough cups, drinks and snacks available.

I'm not sure that 'just' doing the washing up quite covers it — not having to wash up is quite a gift when a busy parent! She also commented that it is really lovely

to be able to sit with parents and grandparents, get to know them and enjoy their company. "What a wonderful selection of toys and activities are available for the babies and little ones to enjoy!" she said.

Natalie, another volunteer, told me the reason she helps is because she had enjoyed coming along each week when her son, now at school, was small. The friendships she and her son made have been really precious, and he used to love snuggling up with a book from the book collection. She said, "It is good to be able to give something back, and Cookie Club is such an important part of our community."

Another parent, Jenny, has been coming here over the years with her own children and children in her care. She talked to me while we were sitting near the dressing up box, remembering how her daughter Bridie, now all grown up, used to love the princess dresses and twirling around. How lovely it was to come back and see a new generation of little ones delighting in the same dresses and other dressing up clothes!



As I left, the last children and parents were heading out the door, and toys were being packed away for another week. Another generation of young families are enjoying the opportunity to find friendship, a listening ear and a place to play in the heart of our village. If you are a parent, grandparent or carer of babies or pre-school children, a warm welcome is waiting for you on a Thursday morning.



In other news, work continues to reinstate the 20 minute parking bays outside the old village shop and newsagents which will not only help these units to be re-let as retail outlets but also give parents an alternative drop off/pick up area for the school. We are part of the RSPB charity. Do come and join us! Our group covers an area of mid-Surrey centred on Dorking and includes Leatherhead, Bookham, Epsom and Ewell. We aim to help anyone interested to enjoy nature and are a friendly and inclusive group of enthusiasts. New members are always welcome and a particular effort is made for those who are beginning to explore nature or bird watching.

Saturday 10th June - Stodmarsh National Nature Reserve Lambkin Wall, Stodmarsh, Canterbury. This reserve has the largest reed bed in South East England so be on the lookout for reed bunting, reed & sedge warblers. With luck, we will see a hobby in the summer.



Saturday 24th June - Brockham Quarry An easy walk around the disused quarry.

Saturday 8th July - Farnham Heath Rural Life Living Museum There are no facilities but the Rural Life Museum has toilets and a good café. We will be looking for resident Dartford warblers, tree pipits and woodlarks.

Sunday 30th July - Milton Court and Landbarn Farm Milton Court Farm, Dorking. John is going to show us around his farmland to look for a great variety of farmland birds.

Saturday 12th August - Knepp Knepp Estate, Swallows Lane, Dial Post. There are no toilets on the estate but the Stork Cafe kiosk should be open and also has a shop selling estate meats. This is the time of year to look for the elusive purple emperor butterflies and white storks should be displaying well.



Saturday 2nd September - Chidham Cobnor Farm Amenity Car Park, Chidham Lane, Chichester. There are no facilities. The Chidham Peninsula Walk covers a variety of habitats and will be good for waders and wildfowl. Osprey will still be in the area and wheatears should be seen.

Sunday 17th September - Oare Marshes, Faversham. Walk is planned to coincide with high tide. Hoping to

# WESTCOTT HISTORY GROUP



#### The Pilgrims Way Legend

At our meeting in May 2013 Elyot Turner, an erstwhile transport and town planner, gave us the benefit of his research into the bibliography of the popularly termed 'Pilgrims Way' which has traditionally been held to run from Winchester to Canterbury and passes along the side of Ranmore Common. In modern times walkers of this route have overnighted in Westcott at villagers' houses. The question is – did it originate as a medieval Pilgrimage Route or was it a Victorian invention?

Elyot told us that he had found the British Library Map Room very helpful in his researches but no early maps or Christopher Martin's book on the Pilgrim's Way (PW) mentioned a medieval route of this name. A map of 1769 showed a very short section called the Pilgrim's Way east of Otford in Kent. Major General Sir Henry James, Director of the Ordnance Survey from 1854, who first put places of historical interest on OS maps, inserted the route only in Surrey. In 1871 a pamphlet by the young surveyor Edward James (no relation) discussed the route along the side of the Downs in terms of a Pilgrims Way. Later editions of the OS Maps showed the route as Pilgrim's Way (course of) and even changed its course from time to time! It was perhaps these developments that fired the public imagination.

Two books from the end of the 19th C. by Julia Cartwright and Hilaire Belloc promoted the existence of the Pilgrims Way as a pilgrimage route to the Canterbury shrine of Archbishop

# WESTCOTT HISTORY GROUP (cont.)



Thomas Becket (murdered there in 1170). Arguably the most comprehensive book about 'pilgrims' in medieval England by Diana Webb identifies hundreds of shrines between St Swithins at Winchester and Rochester on the Medway, but there is no evidence of groups of people setting out in a consistent way on pilgrimages. It seems to have been a fairly random custom depending upon people's circumstances; after all the population was small and rural folk had little time for leisure.



There was another pilgrimage route from London along Watlina Street Canterbury made famous by the writing Geoffrey Chaucer in the

Canterbury Tales, which many will recall from their school days.

Despite the fabled link with Winchester, there was no evidence of a Pilgrim's Way in Hampshire though the name was used for many roads and lanes. However there is a 'Harrow Way' between Basingstoke and Andover. The word 'harrow' was derived from 'hargr' or 'hearg' meaning a shrine or temple on a hill and 'weob' meaning a shrine in a

valley. Little medieval evidence in the way of burials or campsites has been found along any of these routes. Some older churches along the routes have signs on their walls made by pilgrims who have visited them. But the word 'pilgrim' means a 'visitor' or 'stranger'.

Many of the books suggest that the route from Kent along the side of the Downs going westwards has been used as a trading route from Europe, possibly as far as Cornwall for tin, for thousands of years. This was borne out by the discovery in 2002 of the Bronze Age grave of the 'Amesbury Archer'. An analysis of his teeth suggests that he came from the Alps!

Elyot's conclusion was that the many so-called 'Pilgrim's Ways' were primarily trading routes which have occasionally been used by pilgrims. The term really derives from the Victorian era when it was a clever Ordnance Survey marketing ploy which helped to sell their maps!

The WLHG committee encourages readers to suggest subjects and lecturers that they feel are of interest, especially concerning Westcott and Surrey in general. There is no lecture currently scheduled.





#### **Bee Thoughtful This Summer**

Summer is well under way and hopefully you have heard the sound of bees busy in the bushes and flowers around the village. I say hopefully, because bees are in trouble, not just here in the UK but there is a decline in bees and pollinators across the world.

#### **Bee Facts**

There are over 20,000 known species of bee globally, and there are around 270 bee species recorded in the UK. Different characteristics make them suited to different plants. The small and agile Early Bumblebee's (often seen as early as February), make them perfect to enter plants with drooping flowers like comfrey, while the slightly bigger garden bumblebees, are much better at pollinating the deep flowers of honeysuckle and foxgloves. Solitary nonstinging, Red Mason Bees are 120 times more efficient at pollinating apple blossoms than honeybees.



There is even evidence, to suggest that natural pollination by the right type of bee, improves the quality of the crops in terms of their nutritional value and shelf life. The study showed that bumblebees and solitary bees feed from different parts of strawberry flowers. In combination with each other, they produced bigger, juicier and more evenly-shaped strawberries. How amazing is that!

Of course, we all know that pollinators are important, but I wonder how many of us have actually stopped to think how important they might be. Almost 90% of wild plants and 75% of leading global crops depend on animal/insect pollination. One in three mouthfuls of every spoonful of the food we eat depends on pollinators. Even plants grown to feed livestock for meat production, such as clover and alfalfa, depend on bee pollination.

#### Why are pollinators under threat?

Three bumblebee species have become extinct in recent decades. The recent European Red List for Bees reports that almost one in ten species of wild bee face extinction, and over the past 50 years, half the bee, butterfly and moth species studied in the 2013 State of Nature Report have declined. We can directly link these declines to changes in the way we farm. The intensification of agriculture has led to the destruction of habitat, and what is left is becoming increasingly fragmented. Further habitat loss is driven by urbanisation, and insect pollinators are also affected by the heavy use of pesticides and herbicides,

the effects of climate change, and disease. Thirty-five species of our UK bees are currently under threat of extinction.

#### **Changing Landscapes**

Maintaining our native flora depends on healthy pollinator populations. This includes wildflowers such as poppies, cornflowers and bluebells, as well as trees and shrubs. The close relationship between pollinators and the plants they pollinate is evident in the parallel declines seen across the UK and Europe: 76% of plants preferred by bumblebees have declined in recent decades.



Some bees have a particular affinity to certain plants, meaning they need a specific habitat. In the UK the scabious bee, our largest mining bee, relies on the pollen of scabious flowers for its survival. These plants grow on sandy or chalky open grassland, an important habitat for a variety of bees and pollinators. Unfortunately, these habitats are now under increasing threat from changing land use. The

loss of particular habitats like this, is one of the main drivers of bee and pollinator decline.

Insensitive urban development and intensive farming have caused significant losses and fragmentation of pollinator-friendly habitats. The loss of these key habitats on farmland in particular, has meant that wildlife. including pollinators, have become dependent on protected wildlife sites. Unfortunately, according to government figures, only 6% of habitats protected under law are in a 'favourable condition'. Since the Second World War, we've lost 97% of our wildflower meadows, leaving our bees and pollinators with little natural habitat.

#### What can we do to help?

With so much of the habitat loss occurring across the country, some pollinator populations have been cut off from one another. One thing we can do to help is to try to support the infrastructure to enable our pollinators to get from one place to another. Imagine trying to travel around Britain without our road and rail networks. Or imagine if nine out of every ten miles of road just didn't exist - life would be very difficult. B-Lines are an imaginative and beautiful solution to the problem of the loss of flowers and pollinators. B-Lines are a series of 'insect pathways' running through our countryside and towns. They link existing wildlife areas

together, creating a network, like a railway, that will weave across the British landscape.

Westcott could become a part of this network assisting pollinators to migrate from one area to another. This would increase their opportunity to mate and find other food sources which might at the moment, be beyond their little wings reach. If you would like to help our pollinators this summer or next, then please think about the flowers you grow in your garden. Or perhaps, if you don't have green fingers, you might create a habitat for bees, you don't need a hive. Solitary bees including Mining bees, nest in the around, or Mason bees and Leafcutter bees nest in holes in dead wood. banks and walls.


