

Our thanks to everyone who came to the WVA Annual General Meeting on the 29th June, it is always good to have an opportunity to meet face to face and update each other on village news. Full meeting notes and copies of the annual report and accounts will be posted on the village website for everyone to view.

Green Belt Sites which had been proposed for allocation in the Local Plan. The Council has now requested a further unspecified delay https:// futuremolevalley.org/wp-content/ uploads/2023/05/ED61-Councils-Note-33-Requesting-an-Extension-to-the-Pause.pdf We will continue to monitor the situation and will update again when there is more clarity on the timetable.

Sondes Place Farm

We were pleased to note that Mole Valley District Council have REJECTED the planning application made by Gleeson Land to develop 144 dwellings on Green Belt land at Sondes Place Farm. Westcott Road. The WVA will continue to monitor this situation for any appeals or further applications. Our thanks to all the residents who wrote their own objection letters and signed the petition, all of which helped demonstrate the strength of local opposition to the proposed development.

MVDC Local Plan

You may recall the Local Plan process was delayed at the request of MVDC in December 2022 to the 25th May 2023. The Inspector decided to issue her proposed modifications to the draft Local Plan in any event. Inspector's modifications kept all

Natural England's consultation on whether to make changes to the Surrey Hills AONB to extend the greas included and make some other changes to the boundary closed on the 13th June. Following liaison with the Surrey Hills AONB and MVDC Planning Officers the WVA submitted a response to Natural England with respect to the area to the northwest of Dorking. A copy of the WVA's response can be viewed on the village website under planning.

Westcott is a village long-renowned for its strong sense of community spirit. The Baby Meals service exemplifies this, as volunteers from around the village come together to support others when they most need it. The service has been providing much-needed support to families with newborns for over 20 years and more recently, has also supported other households in the village who may be facing difficulties. Established originally by Holy Trinity church, Baby Meals remains a cherished institution in the village. We usually help around 5-6 Westcott households every year. Our volunteer cooks generously buy, cook and deliver a hot meal for the whole family, usually for 2 weeks offering much needed respite for new parents and others in crisis.

Supporting Families: Welcoming a new baby into the family is an exciting and joyous occasion, but it can also be a time of exhaustion and adjustment. We know from the feedback we receive just how wonderful it is when dinner is one less thing to think about during new-baby chaos!

Crisis meals: We can also provide meals if you or someone in the household is going through a serious illness, facing financial hardship, or dealing with other challenges. We know it can be a huge relief to have meals even a few times a week during difficult times.

Get in touch: If you live in Westcott and are expecting a baby or experiencing difficulties and would like to request meals please contact us. It usually takes only few days to create a rota. There is no charge for this service.

For many, these groups are the face and voice of the RSPB and can be an essential force in the fight to save nature.

Local groups for local people

Run exclusively by people like you, the volunteer-led local group network extends from Guernsey to Inverness and from Essex to Fermanagh. There are currently over 130 of these enthusiastic groups flying the flag for the RSPB, bringing people together and making a difference for nature wherever they live.

So, what do local groups actually do?

Here are a few things you may not know about our local groups:

- Since they began in 1969 local groups have raised over £25 million for the RSPB and continue to add to this total every year.

- You certainly don't need to be a bird expert to join a local group. Many groups run special social events for beginners and all are welcome on a variety of group outings, whether exploring the local area or enjoying an organised coach trip to a nature reserve. For many, joining a group is a great way to meet people and make new friends. It's a chance to learn more about birds and nature, but also to share your own knowledge and have fun!

Connection to nature is proven to improve wellbeing and some local groups run nature-themed walks in conjunction with the NHS social prescribing service while other groups run regular walks for carers, giving them a well-earned break. RSPB Dorking and District local group covers the local area, has regular walks and meetings in person and online to provide the chance to learn more in a friendly way. WESTCOTT HISTORY GROUP



History of Gomshall Tannery

On 11 Sept 2012 Colin Woolmington gave a talk on his experiences working with with Gomshall Tannery. He came from a farming family in Shere and joined the company in 1959 just as it was growing into a large enterprise.

Tanning is an ancient industry and was important in Surrey from about 1500 in Tudor times. There were tanneries in many villages across the county, the main requirements being an ample supply of water and oak trees for the ground bark used in the tanning process.



The tannery in Gomshall had many owners over the centuries and in 1892 was destroyed by a disastrous fire. It was rebuilt on the same site on the south side of the Tillingbourne stream. In 1917 it was acquired by Union International, who became part of the Vestey Group of companies which owned four tanneries and produced a huge range of products from their

cattle ranching interests in Brazil and sheep farms in New Zealand. Hides and skins arrived from abattoirs in the UK and all over the world. The Gomshall tannery itself processed over 25,000 pelts each week. Skins from New Zealand came in barrels each containing 48 dozen skins packed in tight.

Colin, who had been a manager at Gomshall, explained that each skin had its own quirks. The challenge for the tanner was to turn the raw material with all its variations into a product which had the consistent quality required by the customer. It was vitally important to prevent the skins from rotting.

On arrival the skins were scraped clean by men with flensing knives on curved boards to remove remaining fat and hair before being dunked into cement lined pits full of limed water to be cleaned, then washed in fresh water pits. After this they passed through hand operated rollers (like mangles) to remove excess water before being 'tanned' or cured in a tannin solution and sometimes further treated with vegetable or chrome compounds to obtain beautiful colours. New technology was used for some processes but mostly it depended on the skills of the men.

It was a crowded workplace and one could imagine the noise, heat and

smells. About 120 people worked in the tannery in its heyday. Most came from Gomshall but others came from nearby villages including Westcott. It was also interesting to note that some of the machinery was manufactured by the nearby Mickle

The tannery itself did not make any articles from the leather it produced but once a year on the first Saturday in October the Tannery Shop in the main street of Gomshall held a sale of manufactured items, including a product range of leather used for high fashion and soft furnishings. It seemed scarcely possible that these products had come from humble animal skins.

Colin concluded his talk with a recording of "Rawhide", a hit song which took us back to the 1950s, when the tannery was reaching its peak. Operations ceased in the early 1980s and the tannery was again sadly destroyed by fire in 1988 and an era of industrial and social history came to an end.







DORKING MUSEUM



After a frustrating period of closure due to fire, at the time of writing, the necessary repair work to the Museum roof is expected to be carried out shortly so that decorators, cleaners and carpet fitters can get to work reinstalling fittings, paintings and artefacts can be rehung and display cases refilled. There is not currently a firm date for re-opening the main gallery, but please check the website, social media and other local sources for further news.

Although the main exhibition area has remained closed, the team has been able to continue with restoration of items damaged by fire or water, collection care work, archive queries, school loan boxes and care home memory boxes. The cave tour and guided walks programmes are running as usual. Even the family activity and education team has been taking taught sessions out to schools and hosting a series of very successful family activity sessions at Dorking Library.

Family Activities: The Museum continues free monthly family activities at Dorking Library with a Pretend Archaeological Dig at a 'castle' (Saturday 15th July, 10am-noon): carefully uncover an object, clean it, draw and measure it, think about what it is, where it came from and what it tells us about the past. A Reading Challenge (Thursday August 24th,

2-4pm): look up facts in non-fiction books and colour a picture linked to the Library challenge. Aimed at 4–11 year olds, materials are provided, and children must be accompanied.

Our village has a long-standing association with Papua Partners, an impactful international organisation which has been working alongside indigenous people in West Papua, since it was founded here in Westcott in 2006.

West Papua, the Western half of the island of New Guinea, has been subjected to colonization by the Republic of Indonesia since the 1960s and is currently in the grip of a humanitarian crisis. The decades-long conflict between the Indonesian military and armed rebels has escalated in recent weeks and indigenous West Papuans are caught in between, leading to horrific human rights abuses. Every day there are more reports from the partners of torture, intimidation and murder of innocent civilians. Villagers face restrictions in carrying out day to day activities, as Indonesian state forces continue to act with impunity in what they attempt to legitimise as a war against terror.

The land of West Papua forms part of the third largest tropical rainforest area in the world and is home to incredible biodiversity. It is also rich in mineral resources. This means that the region has become a hotspot for extractive industries, to feed the global demand for palm oil, gold and other resources. This poses an acute threat to the

forests and indigenous people. Many fear that the ongoing conflict is being used as an excuse to make way for ongoing resource extraction.

At the end of April the military set fire to 16 villages in the Intan Jaya region, causing villagers to flee in terror. This is part of an ongoing pattern of intimidation and forced displacement by the state military. There are currently more than 60,000 internally displaced people who've fled to safety into the jungle, where they are eking out an existence, without access to education or health care. Visits from human rights monitors and humanitarian groups are prohibited by the Indonesian government and many of our partners' only hope lies in the possibility of international intervention

Papua Partners are therefore conducting an urgent fundraising appeal to build a campaign that can raise awareness and "open the eyes of the world" to the fate of Indigenous Papuans - a request that has been made by all partners in the region,



and something they believe will play a critical role in their struggle for peace and justice. Any donations that you are able to make will be incredibly helpful in supporting our partners to document the situation, amplify their voices, broaden and significantly increase their audience, including through social media campaigns, updating the website, and a new audio interview series.

Many thanks to Revd Tim who, at the time of writing, is planning an incredible one-day 88-mile run from Canterbury to Westcott in June, to raise money

Sunflower Secrets

At our stall at Westfest this year we invited children to plant sunflower seeds, which they watched sprout at home before bringing them along to the Community Garden at half term. At our 'Sunflower session', children decorated a larger pot for their seedling to grow in at the Community Garden, to attract pollinators and to see which one will grow the tallest! They'll hopefully be in bloom by the time this article reaches you, so do come by the garden, in the churchyard at \$t John's, Furlong Road, to see them.



Sunflowers are beneficial to nature and people in many ways, not least because their bright yellow cheery appearance is attractive to bees and other pollinators and can help to brighten our mood and bring happiness. They make a great natural source of food in a wildlife-friendly garden for bees and birds, particularly greenfinches and gold-

finches who love the seeds from dried sunflower heads.

Sunflowers provide food for us too, sunflower oil is a good source of Vitamin E and sunflower seeds are a good plant-based source of protein and contain nutrients which boost immune system health, bone strength, and brain function. In fact, the whole sunflower plant is edible – from the root to the petals. It is even possible to make flour from the pith inside the stalk!

However, you need to be careful where you grow sunflowers in a vegetable garden. While they make good companion plants for tomatoes and squash, they can have a negative effect on crops such as potatoes. Sunflowers can have allelopathic effect, which means they excrete chemicals which can inhibit seed germination and stunt the growth of certain other crops grown close by.

One of the sunflower's hidden talents is that they are able to naturally decontaminate soil, by soaking up hazardous materials in the ground, including lead and uranium. Sunflowers are hyperaccumulators, which means that they are able to take up high concentrations of toxic materials via their roots, which are then stored in their stems and leaves, leaving the soil cleaner and healthier.

GREEN WESTCOTT (cont.)



One of the most fascinating thing about sunflowers is the way their seed spirals beautifully display hidden mathematical rules shaping many patterns of life. The Fibonacci sequence, in which each number is the sum of the previous two (1, 1, 2, 3, 5, 8, 13, 21, 34, 55, 89...) can be found plentifully in nature from a nautilus shell to romanesque cauliflower and sunflowers. Count the clockwise and counter-clockwise seed spirals that reach the outer edge, and you'll usually find a pair of numbers from the sequence: 34 and 55, or 55 and 89. The seeds of a sunflower are arranged in a way that makes the most efficient use of the available space to allow the seed to flourish



The golden angle, 137.5°, plays an important role in this optimal self-organising pattern. The golden angle is formed by dividing the 360 degrees of a circle by the golden ratio – 1.618. The Golden Ratio, known as the Greek letter Phi, is seen in the ratio between two successive numbers above 5 in the Fibonacci sequence, which gets closer to 1.618 as the

numbers get larger. It is often referred to as the 'divine proportion' as shapes based upon this ratio are particularly aesthetically pleasing. A slight deviation of the arrangement of seeds from the golden angle would cause a sunflower face to look completely different, as illustrated in this graphic:

As they grow, sunflowers turn their face to track the sun – always looking for the light. In this way they inspire optimism and with their ability to survive in a vast range of conditions, sunflowers are a symbol of strength and resilience to overcome challenges and to find hope in the face of adversity.

To finish on a practical note - at the end of the season when the sunflower has wilted and all the seeds have been harvested, or eaten by birds, a dried sunflower head apparently makes a good natural scrubbing brush, though I've yet to put this to the test!
