

#### BUT WHAT IS IT REALLY LIKE ...?

I finally managed to take the children to Dorking leisure centre this summer. I enjoy swimming but find visiting a new pool for the first time a rather stressful experience. Which way do

I enter the changing rooms? Are there separate men's and women's changing spaces or one area with individual cubicles? What change or tokens do I need to use the lockers? At what point am I meant to take off my shoes? Will I be able to navigate the

inevitable maze from the changing area to the pool itself – a problem exacerbated by the fact I need to leave my glasses in the locker and cannot see a thing without them?



There are many good reasons people have for not wanting to go to church, but often I find when talking to people that they have never ventured to a service for the same reason I put off going to a new swimming pool – they have no idea what to expect and (more importantly) what the expectations of them might be.

I asked two people in Westcott who

have been along to our church for the first time this year to share what they expected it to be like, and what coming along was actually like. Jon came along on a Sunday with his family for the first time last year:

'Although I've always enjoyed the architecture and aesthetics of churches, I still expect a feeling of stuffiness, an older generation in their Sunday best, a feeling that I don't belong... This is of course, "contempt prior to investigation", and as usual, I was completely wrong!

The first thing that took me back when walking through the doors of Holy Trinity was that I knew almost everyone in there! So many friendly faces of all ages, my daughter who was I at the time felt at home with

the other children she'd met at Cookie Clubs. My wife and I chatted with some friends we hadn't seen for a while and we both felt entirely

at ease, part of the community. Although my preconceptions of formality had been shown to be wrong, I was still worried about "all the singing and prayers", as a spiritual person I was happy to go with the flow and was made to feel part of the

congregation despite, at times, not knowing what was going on! We've been back since, and most recently I went to the monthly evening worship and thoroughly enjoyed the calm and mindfulness that comes with connecting with the church.'

Peter also started coming along to Holy Trinity last year:






### DORKING AND DISTRICT RSPB



#### **Red Kite**

Many of us will have noticed larae birds cruising the skies above that we don't recall seeina in the past. Conspicuous and slowflying, the bird twists its forked tail and lona. narrow wings continually as it makes the most of the air currents. The flexibility and tail shape



distinguish the red kite from the buzzard, which has blunt wings and tail, the buzzard looking much squarer and somehow more solid in the sky. Both kites and buzzards are making a comeback in South East England after centuries of absence.

Kites were common until the 17th century and then declined until only a few remained in a couple of remote valleys in Wales. During the last century, conservation efforts in Wales succeeded so well that in 1989 red kites were reintroduced to several areas including the Chilterns. These bred from 1991 and have prospered and spread across the region. They are long-lived birds – one recently died of injuries in Oxfordshire, having been ringed 29 years earlier as part of the reintroduction study.

Red kites are known as scavengers, especially of carrion. In the Middle Ages they were the equivalent of street cleaners in London and other big cities. Nowadays, road kill forms a major part of their diet. However, they are also excellent predators. When hunting live prey, they strike from a high soaring position, making a rapid feet first plunge to take the prey by surprise. They catch and eat small mammals and sometimes birds by this method.

### Abinger D&G Choir French Connection Concert

The UK may no longer be part of the EU, but the citizens of Surrey were treated to a little bit of French joie de vivre on Saturday 24th June, when the Abinger D&G Choir performed Fauré's Requiem and a selection of other Gallic favourites to a packed audience in St James's church, Abinger Common. The choir was conducted by Musical Director, Martin Hall, and supported by professional soprano soloist, Elizabeth Fullylove, and pianist, Ian Ledingham, from the Royal Academy of Music.



Organist and D&G chorister, Karen Borrett, got the evening off to a rousing start with César Franck's Chorale in A minor, and the first half continued with Fauré and Debussy solos, a Chausson melody and Op.56 1 Berceuse from Fauré's Dolly Suite, which was immediately familiar to older audience members as the theme from the BBC Home Service's Listen with Mother. The first half concluded with a virtuoso rendition of Claude Debussy's Clair de Lune.

The second half was devoted to The D&G Choir performing Gabriel Fauré's perennially popular Requiem, which concluded the evening to enthusiastic applause from an appreciative audience. Elizabeth Fullylove and D&G Choir chairman, Martin Perry, sang the soprano and bass solos, respectively.

### WESTCOTT HISTORY GROUP



#### Magicians and the Music Hall

In February 2013 we had a highly entertaining talk on Magicians & the Music Hall from Robin Maddy, a member of the Magic Circle. Magic in England started as long ago as 1603 and it began with a trick which is still popular today. This was done with a length of white cord, which had the two ends tied together and then a member of the audience was asked to cut it in 4 places. Abracadabra, he displayed the cord complete.

With his slides of famous personalities and their tricks the story of magicians fairly skipped along. John Maskelyne started in 1873, set up in Egypt Hall, London, and continued successfully for 30 years entertaining the public.



He teamed up with Alfred Cooke who later retired, to be replaced by David Devant and his family. They invented the Levitation of the Lady and the Magic Kettle out of which poured

whatever you wanted – coffee, sherry, whisky, you name it – one after the other! Next came the Egg Trick, where an endless number of real eggs was produced from his top hat and handed to one of his children until they could hold no more; all dropped and broke on the floor. Audiences at that time thought this was hilarious. The Indian Rope Trick first appeared in 1890. A Hindu played his pipe and the rope ascended as if by itself; a small boy climbed the rope and disappeared!

Maskelyne died in 1914 and Jasper Devant joined the show. In 1921 the Devants invented Sawing the Lady in Half. This trick was taken up by other magicians and was very popular in America. Jasper Devant became a Major in WWII and specialized in camouflage techniques.

Next we heard about Chung Ling Soo whose first big trick was Firing a Lady from a Cannon into a Box. He then developed the Bullet Catching



Trick in which he asked people in the audience to mark three musket balls and load them into three old muskets. He stood across the stage holding a

china plate against his chest – the muskets were fired; smoke, flame and noise – and he would spit the marked balls out onto the plate!

Unfortunately this trick did not work properly in 1932 at the Wood Green Empire and the poor chap was shot dead. It transpired that his real name was William Ellsworth Robinson; he just appeared as a Chinaman. In all, 13 magicians have died doing this trick.



to make money doing tricks from a book by the Frenchman Robert Houdin. He was small, very fit and strong, and amazed everybody by escaping from the most elaborate padlocked chains and handcuffs even from inside a tank full of water. He performed in films and befriended Arthur Conan Doyle with whom he corresponded on magical matters.

After a show in Canada some students punched him very hard in the stomach as a test! A few days later he was appearing in Philadelphia, became very ill and died of peritonitis on 31 October 1926. His wife, Bess, who was with him and the doctors when he died was heard to say "Goodbye Harry and Goodnight".

The Magic Circle was founded by a group of amateurs in 1905 at Pinoli's Restaurant in Wardour St, London and now has a headquarters in Euston where members meet to exchange ideas and experiences. King Charles III qualified as a member in 1975 when he was Prince of Wales.

#### DORKING MUSEUM



After a lengthy and frustrating period of closure, the necessary repair work to the roof of the Museum building should be completed and the interior display area will be being restored ready for re-opening. At the time of writing, it is planned that the Museum will open its doors again during October.

**Blue plaques:** Dorking Museum and the Dorking Society have a blue plaque programme marking places of historic significance in the town and surrounding area. In August, one was unveiled in Tutts Close to mark the site of the workshop of the groundbreaking Rob Walker Racing team, which competed in Formula One from 1953 to 1970.

On September 17th, at the Waitrose site, another will commemorate the celebrated aeronautical engineer



Beatrice Shilling, whose technical innovation improved the performance and safety of our fighting aircraft and made a significant contribution to success in the Second World War.

Talk: Tuesday, 5th September, 5pm-6.30pm. Charles Taylor will be visiting Dorking from the US. He has been researching his ancestry and traced it back to Dorking, from where his ancestor, Samuel Taylor, crossed to the colony in the late 17th century, a generation after William Mullins. He will talk about his family history in Dorking and how Samuel and his descendants fared on the opposite side of the Atlantic. The talk will take place at Dorking Library (see website for details and booking).

Heritage Open Days: As a special free event for Heritage Open Days, the Museum team will open the Grade 2\* listed Hope family Mausoleum at the heart of the Deepdene Trail between noon and 4pm on Sunday 10th September, with a brief talk on its history and the Hope family on the hour. There will also be free guided walks of Betchworth Castle (Sunday 10th September, 2.30pm) and Dorking Historic Pubs (Saturday 16th September, 6pm). #### Water, Water Everywhere, Nor Any Drop To Drink!

If we stop for a moment to consider the above Coleridge quote, from The Rime of The Ancient Mariner – as if we were the mariner on that boat – and all about was water that we could not use or drink, how might we feel about our future? Here in the UK, we live in a place with infrastructure which supplies us with good, clean, fresh water. We turn on the tap and it pours out. We probably don't even give it a second thought.



Everything we do in life is reliant on water, for drinking, washing, food growth and production, construction and manufacturing. With the population due to hit 10 billion by 2050 the pressures on all our resources, are set to get worse. With population growth, comes pollution growth and the waste we produce can have detrimental impacts on the water available to us. Sewage pollution and agricultural run-off (soil laden with

biocides and fertilizers) end up in rivers and waterways negatively impacting both biodiversity and human health. Access to water could become one of the biggest and most pressing problems associated with climate change.

A Christian Aid report states that London could run out of water within 25 years and British rivers could lose more than half their water by 2050 as cities around the world face growing risks from drought driven by the climate crisis. As water levels drop, the remaining water can become more saline making it unsuitable for drinking. Both freshwater supplies and underground aquifers are being affected.

Friederike Otto, a senior lecturer in climate science at the Grantham Institute, Imperial College London, said "greenhouse gas emissions have caused rainfall patterns to change and temperatures to increase, making drought more common and more severe in parts of the world".

As with many of the impacts of climate change, the poor and marginalised are most adversely affected. Jonathan Farr, senior policy analyst at WaterAid, says: "Competing demands for water means that those who are poorer or marginalised find it more difficult to get water than the rich and powerful. Many governments and privatised

water companies concentrate their provision on wealthy districts, and prioritise agriculture and industry over poorer people, while turning a blind eye to polluters and those who overextract water from underground sources." Professor Benjamin Sovacool, of Aarhus University Denmark, puts it even more starkly when he said, "There will be no water by 2040 if we keep doing what we're doing today".

So, what is it exactly that we're doing?



#### Food

Agriculture is responsible for about 90 percent of the world's water footprint. One third of all croplands is now being used to produce crops for animal feed. The vast majority of the water consumed by the livestock sector is related to feed production, whereas only about 2% of it is water for drinking and servicing of the animals themselves. Intensive farming practices exacerbate this issue.

#### Fashion

The fashion industry is responsible for the consumption of 79 trillion litres of water annually, contributing to about 20% of industrial wastewater.

#### Electricity

People don't often think of water usage associated with lighting, electronics, and appliances. However, energy production is the second largest consumer of freshwater resources in the world. Huge quantities of water are needed to cool the power producing equipment used to power our energy hungry lives.

Manufacturing



Every product that you buy, requires during the manufacturing process. Approximately 39,000 gallons of water are required to produce a new car including tires, while it takes about 2,100 gallons of water to produce just one pair of leather shoes. So, we can see from these examples that just our everyday lives are creating huge impacts on overall water usage. What might we do to reduce our water footprint (yes indeed you do have one!).
