

INTERGENERATIONAL LIVING

In a previous role, I got to observe the development of an Intergenerational Community Centre in Southwest London. The idea is simple - local older residents are invited to a day centre where they can dip in and out

of intergenerational sessions with preschoolers from the onsite nursery and visiting children from local primary the school. There are activities different every week including singing, games, gardening, readina and exercise classes which are facilitated by a trained team of volunteers.

The beauty and simplicity the arrangement is everyone that has

something to give - and everyone has something to receive. It is a rare example of an absolute winwin. It can improve the health and well-being of the older participants, and the confidence and communication skills of the young.

We have created a society where the interactions between different age groups outside of the immediate family are limited. Many of the reasons for this were side effects of well-intentioned and important attempts to protect the vulnerable, or indeed of technological innovations, but the result has been an increasing divide and lack of connection between those at different stages of life. One of the many wonderful

things about living in a small community Westcott like provides that it opportunities more meaningful for intergenerational encounters to happen - but this does not occur without a degree intentionality. of

have served in the Armed Forces from Britain and the Commonwealth and those who have lost their lives as a result of conflict or terrorism. The WVA will put up the Remembrance Poppies and the Silent Soldier along the A25 for the two week period either side of Armistice Day which takes place on Friday 11th November.



In other news, the WVA has recently submitted an application to Mole Valley District Council Neighbourhood Fund (formerly known as the Neighbourhood Community Infrastructure Levy) for funds to install a new vehicle activated speed limit sign to help slow traffic through the village. A further application is being prepared

for submission with the next round of funding requests in the new year, for repairs and refurbishment to the Westcott Dovecote and Thatched Bus Stop, both of which are an important part of our heritage and an essential facility for bus passengers waiting at the village green. We will update on how these applications progress in due course.

The Sondes Place Farm Planning Appeal is being heard by public inquiry which started on Tuesday 31st October, it is open to the public and is expected to last six days. Further details are available on the MVDC website for anyone who would like to attend in person or follow proceedings online. The WVA has made strong representations on Westcott's behalf and has also been in contact with the HM Planning Inspectorate to ensure our opinions have been heard and we will follow the inquiry proceedings.

DORKING AND DISTRICT RSPB



Coot & Moorhen

Anywhere there is quiet water, there are Rails, dark birds with a distinctive shape and gait. Their bodies are slim to slide through reeds or grasses; the legs, feet and toes relatively long to aid progress running over land, floating vegetation and mud. Only two species are easy to see, swimming on open water and feeding on grassy banks – the Coot and the Moorhen. Nests can be obvious as both species build bulky structures, platforms of vegetation close to or in shallow water.



The Moorhen is black with white flashes along its sides and shows a white tail as it runs away – as it frequently does! Adults have a red frontal shied with a yellow tip, while young birds have black bills. An omnivore, the moorhen eats leaves, worms and insects. It rarely dives, feeding on surface insects and leaves when swimming, or walking on mud or grass and even climbing into shrubs in search of food.

The Coot is black with a prominent white head shield, origin of the phrase "bald as a coot". Mainly vegetarian, it feeds on land, on floating vegetation and in water. It may surface feed, scrape algae off with its head just submerged or dive to reach water plants on the bottom. Its long legs enable it to sprint when required and its toes have distinctive lobes to assist swimming



and diving. It brings any weed collected on dives to the surface before eating, so is sometimes robbed by aggressive ducks. Coots can be extremely aggressive to each other as well, having spectacular fights over territory. They feed their fluffy red-billed chicks for a month, longer than most water birds.

WESTCOTT HISTORY GROUP



The History of Degenhardt's the Draper of Dorking

This was the story of the Degenhardt family and the celebrated shop in South Street which purveyed cloth, clothing, gloves, stockings and many items of haberdashery between 1907 and 1979, told with verve and many anecdotes by Susan Hoad who is the granddaughter of the original founders Charles Degenhardt and his wife Suzie Helena. Charles had been an orphan in Germany and came to England as a Master Baker in the early 1900's. He met his future wife who worked in a Drapers shop and they were married in 1906 and rented a shop in South Street, Dorking with a little house behind it.



They had three daughters May (Susan's mother), Ruth and Joan before the war and Tom and Helen after the war. Each child married and had three children but none joined the firm although they willingly helped during holidays for a small reward. Charles and Helena were very thrifty proprietors and in 1925 they bought the freehold of the shop they were renting from Mr Attlee, the corn merchant, and also the shop next door (which is now Santander).

Susan Hoad related her experiences working in various departments of the shop as a young woman in the late 1940's during her holidays. Many of the staff stayed for a very long time and became experts in their department selling cloth or corsetry, hats, gloves or stockings and haberdashery. There was a workroom on the top floor where customers could have alterations made to clothing they had taken 'on approval' and needed adjustment. The shop was known for its personal service. Actually many people made their own clothes in the early days and measuring out cloth for the requirements in the 'pattern books' which the shop had was a particular expertise.

Assistants who sold gloves and stockings needed to have very smooth hands and well kept fingernails to handle and display their goods. This applied also to assistants who

helped customers fitting corsetry and brassieres – a very personal affair. Several schools in the Dorking area had nominated Degenhardts as their official uniform supplier which was very good for trade. When new stock arrived each department's staff had to sew on all the labels for their goods and had to arrange their own window displays. There was no chatting allowed between staff and a 'floor walker' kept an eye on security and dealt with problems.

Items costing under 5 shillings could be paid in cash over the counter but for amounts above this the bill and the money had to be inserted in a little metal 'tube' which was placed into the pipe system leading to the cashiers sitting in the basement. They would return it in the same way with a receipted bill and the change. All spare brown wrapping paper was carefully preserved and string was kept and knotted together in lengths – a very thrifty policy prevailed. At the end of the day everything had to be covered with sheets and damp sawdust put on the floor to prevent dust rising while it was swept.

Susan remembered the shop's staff as a very friendly group of people, many of whom had worked for the Degenhardts for 20 or 30 years. It was a very sad day when the final sales took place and the shop was closed in 1979 because there was nobody in the family or otherwise who was interested in carrying it on, Dorking lost a well regarded business.

The Ukelele Orchestra of Great Britain makes a visit to the Dorking Halls. This playful and virtuosic group promises an evening of great entertainment and fun. There are also two ballet screenings at the Dorking Halls: Don Quixote, with music by Ludwig Minkus, comes live from the Royal Ballet on 7th, telling the adventures of the eccentric nobleman and his loyal squire. There is a repeat screening of the same show on 12th.

And finally – as it comes right at the beginning of December – a quick mention of the Ladybirds Choir's Christmas concert. Conducted by Helena Twentyman, it will celebrate several singers who have died during the year, including Tony Bennett and Roger Whittaker, along with a selection of Christmas carols and songs.



Dorking Museum was finally able to re-open after nearly a year of closure following a fire in an adjacent building. Although many of the diverse activities of the Museum continued during closure, the volunteer team have been very pleased to welcome visitors back through its doors and resume 'normal service' in the main exhibition space.



All of the cleaning and refurbishment some opportunities for aave reorganisation. If you have not visited recently, there are some interestina new exhibits to look out for. One of the more eye-catching is the model Pterosaur flying from the beams – this is a fish-eating reptile that hunted in this area in the Cretaceous period. A new cabinet houses some of the Ralph Vauahan Williams items that were donated recently, including original photographs and manuscripts signed and amended by the composer when conducting the Leith Hill Music Festivals.

Among other items 'new to view' are







We need to talk about ALAN

When Thomas Edison first illuminated a New York street in 1879, he set in motion the modern era of electric lighting. Many at the time hailed his invention as revolutionary and so it was, but now many environmentalists, naturalists, and medical researchers consider light pollution to be one of the fastest growing and most pervasive forms of environmental pollution there is. A growing body of scientific research suggests that light pollution is having a lasting adverse effect on both human and wildlife health.

Who exactly is ALAN?

Artificial Light At Night (ALAN), impacts on all levels of biodiversity from genes and cells to individuals and populations, communities, ecosystems and landscapes and comes in many forms.



Sky glow - is the bright halo that appears over urban areas at night, you can often see this as you look

towards Dorking from Westcott when you're out in the evening. It is produced by light being scattered by water, dust and gas molecules in the atmosphere.

Light trespass - is where unwanted artificial light from say, a street light, spills into an adjacent property or land which would otherwise have been dark. Think Denbies - if you've ever witnessed this building at night!

Glare - is produced by horizontal lighting such as vehicle lights.

Over-illumination - is where the use of light goes beyond what is required of the lighting, ie, leaving office lights on in a building which is empty.

Why should we care?

Numerous studies have shown negative impacts of liaht pollution on our human health ALAN interferes with our circadian rhythms, and this has been linked to several medical disorders including, insomnia, depression, cancer and cardiovascular disease, 10-15% of our genes are controlled by circadian rhythms, which means that disruption to these cycles will have a negative impact on our health.

ALAN is known to affect the very processes of life, from tiny enzymes

largescale right entire qu to circadian ecosystems. When rhythms get disrupted, they cause the dysregulation of many natural processes such as sleep, feeding patterns and hormone production, which in turn affects the overall of human health and wildlife populations. With new houses popping up all over the place on brownfield and now even greenbelt land, this trend is eating away at those precious 'dark' areas which before, had little light pollution.



We are lucky to live in the Surrey Hills and have an abundance of wildlife on our doorsteps. However, the insects, birds and mammals that we perhaps take for granted are being negatively impacted right under our noses by ALAN.

What is the impact on nature more widely?

Over millions of years, mammals, birds

and insects have evolved to use light cues to determine their behaviour. behaviours such as reproduction, foraging and navigation. Unfortunately, ALAN disrupts these natural behaviours often with dire consequences. We are all familiar with insects madly flying around lights, but this attraction is not natural and can have fatal consequences for those insects drawn in by the light. It can cause exhaustion, increased predation and an inability to navigate meaning that a whopping third of all insects attracted to artificial lights die prematurely.

In recent years, an increase in security measures on many people's houses has meant that we now often have more lights shining on or around our homes, creating even more localised light pollution.

Reproduction and Breeding

Numerous species rely on natural light/dark cycles to regulate their mating behaviours. Courtship displays, finding mates, and territorial marking, are all activities which take place in response to light cues. ALAN has been shown to disrupt these natural behaviours, resulting in lower reproduction rates among certain species.

In the UK alone, studies have shown

that caterpillar populations have declined by 52% in areas with street lighting. Glow worm populations are significantly reduced in artificially lit areas, and dung beetles, who use the moon and stars to navigate, have been found to become disorientated under light polluted skies. The situation is now so serious that ALAN is reducing the nocturnal pollinator visits to flowers, by 62% in some areas.

But it's not just insects who are being affected. Data from a study into the effects of ALAN on blackbirds, found that even low intensities of ALAN, can dramatically negatively affect their reproductive systems.

Trees

Although the data on the impact of



ALAN on birds and mammals is limited, the data on the impact on flora is even more sparse. But one study I did find indicated that, on streets with street lighting, ALAN was impacting leaf growth on trees and shrubs. This study showed that the leaves of certain species developed up to 20 days earlier in the spring than those in the control conditions. This undoubtedly will have implications for the wildlife that depend on the trees for their natural habitat and food.

You see nothing we do in this world is without consequences, each action will and does have an impact. Our skies are so light polluted now, that all life on our planet is being impacted even in the oceans.

If we want to keep our balance on this planet, we need to find ways to live in harmony with nature, respecting it's 'laws' and instead of imposing ourselves onto it, perhaps finding natures' rhythms and beating our drum in tune with hers.
