

Thank you to everyone who came to the WVA Open Meeting at the Prince of Wales on the 21st March. The update on village news included the review of the Westcott Neighbourhood Development Plan. Surrey County Council's Riahts of Way Improvement Consultation and Mole Valley District Council Local Plan. We also had some guest speakers Marisa Heath. Cabinet including Member for the Environment at Surrev County Council, and Westcott's own Tim Way BEM who spoke about the Community Foundation for Surrey, which is a new grant-making charity focused on supporting local good causes.

We are keen for people to step forward and help with the review of the Westcott Neighbourhood Development Plan please. The current plan, which has been in place since 2017, expires in 2026 (a copy of which can be found on the village website). The NDP is an important document which enables us to play a much stronger role in shaping Westcott's future and setting out a positive vision for the future development and needs of our community. Decisions on planning applications are made by reference to both the MVDC Local Plan and Westcott's Neighbourhood Development Plan policies. The main event for April is the Leith Hill Music Festival, with two days of competitions and concerts. On Friday 12th, five choirs from Dorking and the surrounding towns and villages will sing in competition in the morning, rehearse together in the afternoon with the festival conductor Jonathan Willcocks, and then give a concert in the evening. On Saturday 13th another five choirs will take their turn. Both concerts will have the benefit of professional soloists and the Southern Pro Musica orchestra.

Friday's concert will begin with Mendelssohn's Hebrides overture played by the orchestra, after which the choir will sing Vaughan Williams' ravishingly beautiful Serenade to Music and Mozart's highly dramatic Requiem. Saturday's programme will comprise Lux aeterna by the American composer Morten Lauridsen, and Puccini's Messa di Gloria, an impressive setting of the mass, named for its exuberantly joyful Gloria section. This will be Jonathan's final festival after ten years at the helm, so we hope for a full Dorking Halls for his last two concerts.

There are three Royal Ballet screenings at the Dorking Halls this month. First comes a triple bill celebrating the choreographer Kenneth Macmillan, and then Tchaikovsky's *Swan Lake* with a live screening plus a later encore screening.

#### WESTCOTT VILLAGE HALL UPDATE



#### Programme Delay, Fundraising and Community Support

Following the village consultation in November the trustees' professional advisers submitted a document and request for pre-application advice from Mole Valley District Council (MVDC) Planning Department just before Christmas. At the time of writing MVDC planners have confirmed that they have not yet started reviewing this which sadly means a delay to our programme. In the meantime, the Development Group and their advisers continue to use the waiting time constructively and have tendered quotations for all reports which might be required to support a planning application. We await MVDC planner's response before the planning application is submitted. This is unlikely to be before June 2024. We will ensure that details of the proposed planning application scheme are shared with the neighbours of the two sites and the village is notified before the application is submitted. Please keep an eye on <a href="https://www.westcottvillagehall.com/">https://www.westcottvillagehall.com/</a> and other digital communication channels to keep up to date. The application will primarily be focused on access, site layout, building scale and massing and materials. Details on the developed internal design of the new community building will be the subject of further consultation with the village and existing users after planning consent has been secured.

It is a priority for the trustees that we have and maintain funds for the operation and management of the Village Hall to ensure that it remains open for business. In addition, we currently have sufficient funds to meet the cost of submitting the planning application. However, there will be some further technical information that will be needed post planning consent and further funds will be needed to meet these costs. The trustees are therefore focusing on fundraising initiatives. We are holding a Table Top Sale on 20th April, a Pie and Mash – Quiz Evening on 18th May and a Rock Choir Evening on 7th June 2024, details of which are elsewhere in this issue. Please get involved in our endeavours, this project is now at the stage where we all need to start to work together to deliver our new village hall.

The trustees have recently been successful in a Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) application for a sum of money needed for health and safety work on the existing building and have recently initiated two grant applications to help meet the professional fees post-planning. We expect to make further grant applications as and when they are needed.

Jim Brodrick has recently joined the trustees and we are extremely grateful to have his extra help and support. There is an open meeting on April 24th at 7pm at the Village Hall. Please come along and get involved.

#### Notice of a Meeting of the Trustees of Westcott Village Hall Trust CIO at the Westcott Village Hall on Wednesday, April 24th 2024 at 7pm



Westcott Village Hall Trust CIO is governed by its trustees. With limited exceptions (and reflecting how modern charities are generally run) only the trustees are entitled to attend and vote at meetings. However, in the interest of transparency and good governance, the trustees have adopted a policy to declare their quarterly meeting to be held in April each year as an 'open meeting' which residents may attend as observers.

This year, the trustees' April meeting will be held in Westcott Village Hall at 7pm on Wednesday, 24th April 2024 and all residents of Westcott and the neighbourhood are warmly invited to attend as observers. The business of the meeting will include:

- (i) a review of the CIO's report and accounts for the year ended 31 December 2023 which are currently in the course of preparation;
- (ii) the appointment (or, if eligible, re-appointment) of trustees;
- (iii) a proposal to defer the review of the ClO's report and accounts for this and future calendar years to the trustees' meeting to be held in September or October of the following year to allow for the possibility that the preparation by the trustees of the accounts, and their review by an Independent Examiner, will become more complex if the redevelopment project proceeds as is intended, annual accounts not being due for filing with the Charity Commission until the end of October in the following year;
- (iv) a proposal to increase the quorum requirement for meetings of trustees from two to four:
- (v) consequential amendments to the Governance Rules and to the Constitution to reflect items (iii) and (iv) above, if adopted; and
- (vi) such matters concerning the operations of the CIO as may arise and be appropriate for discussion in an open forum.

#### **Dawn Chorus**

Many forms of wildlife watching involve a degree of discomfort - Arctic cold, tropical humidity, windswept headlands or small boats in choppy seas. At this season, however, we can enjoy one of the world's best wildlife experiences while still in bed. Even in cities, but certainly in our area rich in mature gardens with shrubs and trees, the dawn chorus reaches its peak in May. As the breeding season hots up, male birdsong reaches its zenith because the territory for food-gathering must be protected. For many species, strong musical performance also offers the opportunity for liaisons with willing females.



Almost all birds sing as the day gets light. This proclaims "I've survived the night and this is still my patch." It also makes good use of the time between waking and having enough light and warmth for insects to take wing and the serious business of food gathering for a hungry brood to start. For many migrants such as the warblers, the males arrive first to set up territories, so the dawn chorus provides the first point of contact for prospective pairs.

It is worth getting up in the dark (around 4am) at least once in May to enjoy the

full benefit of the experience outdoors. Wear a fleece, take a plastic bag and a cushion to sit on, settle quietly and wait. The tawny owl hoots as it retires to its daytime roost in a large tree after a night of hunting. Not long after, a robin begins to sing. Then every robin within earshot competes. Blackbirds soon join in with their melodies. Robins and blackbirds have large pupils and so see more at dawn and dusk than most garden birds. The chaffinches, the pigeons and doves are heard next. Then the others join the chorus in rapid succession. The dawn chorus is an experience, not a tutorial, so don't expect to learn to identify birdsong during the dawn chorus. Lots of individuals of every species are all singing at once in a glorious cacophony.

#### The Distinguished Residents of Milton Heath House



The house was built in 1872 for Arthur Powell, the son of a wealthy London wine merchant. He was not particularly interested in wine making but he appreciated that the business depended on bottles and decanters and he developed a glass making factory in the Whitefriars area of London that had once housed a Carmelite monastery. Whitefriar's glass soon became a household name and the family fortunes were



enhanced the by company's stained glass. Examples of this can be seen in church windows throughout the country, including at Holv Trinity Church here in Westcott.

After Arthur Powell's death in 1894 the house was bought by James Carr Saunders, a London Underwriter but it was his granddaughter, Madeleine Slade, who lived at the house while her father, Admiral Sir Edmond Slade, was serving overseas. Her name is now remembered because of her association with Mahatma Gandhi. She read Gandhi's biography by Romain Rollands in 1924 and was so fascinated by his principles of 'non violence'. She wrote and asked Gandhi if she could become his disciple and live in his ashram in Gujarat.

In 1925 Madeleine, aged 33, travelled to India where Gandhi gave her the name Mira Behn (Sister Mira). She learned to speak Hindi, took a vow of celibacy and as Mira Behn accompanied Gandhi throughout his non-violent campaign for India's freedom from British rule. She was also at his side in England in 1931-1934 when they attended the Round Table Conferences on the future of India. Before returning she had interviews with British politicians including Lord Halifax, Churchill, Attlee and Lloyd George on Indian independence. She was active in spreading the spirit of non-violence and was considered by the British to be important to India's independence which eventually led to the partition into India and Pakistan in 1947.

Gandhi was assassinated on 30th June 1948 by a Hindu nationalist because he was considered too outspoken in defence of the Muslims. The assassins were executed. Mira Behn remained in India for the next 11 years before returning to England in 1959, and a year later went to live near Vienna where she died in 1982 gaed 90. She wanted to live in the country of Beethoven whom she greatly admired and whose music she enjoyed playing on the piano. The Indian government awarded her the Padma Vibhushan medal - the country's second highest civilian honour for distinguished services to the development of farming and rural communities. She wrote an autobiography entitled The Spirit's Pilarimage in 1960.



1930 Cartier clasp for £121,000

The next family to live in this house in the early 1900's was that of Jacques Cartier of the Paris jewellery firm. He had numerous

contacts with the Maharajahs in India, many of whom came to stay at Milton Heath during the 1920's and 1930's. The firm of Alfred Cartier had been long established as a jeweller in Paris but at the beginning of the 20th century the founder entrusted its international future to his three

sons. Louis took over responsibility in Paris, Pierre went to New York and Jacques Cartier, the youngest, was assigned to the London office. He purchased Milton Heath House (and Sondes Place next door). From there he travelled extensively buying pearls from sheikhs in the Middle East, and establishing profitable contacts with India's Maharajahs.

After Jacques' death in 1944 his son, Jean Jacques, continued to live there and it was 'JJ' who successfully objected to a proposal to build a large housing estate on Milton Heath citina. in addition to other environmental arauments, the additional traffic entering the Westcott Road where his grandson had been killed in a motor accident in 1962. The house is now used as an office by TMB Marketing and some other firms.

#### PLAYING THE ORGAN AT HOLY TRINITY

When I bought a house with my wife Mary in the Paddock, we were delighted to find we were near the church. We started going to Evensong, and after a few months I became aware that there was a vacancy to play the Organ. I had a chat with the organist, Charles Helier, and he encouraged me to have a go. I started playing for the small congregation.

The vicar, Alan Jonas gave me cover as he had a strong singing voice, and set the tempo. During the week, I practiced and Mary came to listen. I asked her if it was OK, and she gave an honest answer "no!" So I went to see Martin Ellis, director of music at St Martin's Dorking, and an erstwhile pupil of the famous organist George Thalben Ball. Martin was reluctant to take me on as all his other pupils were teenagers aiming for organ scholarships at university. I said I just wanted to improve my playing at Westcott, and he agreed to teach me, but only on the condition that I practiced hard. He introduced me to playing Bach, then moved to more modern works once I had made progress, but I was relieved to find that most organ works were simpler than the ones he set me to learn.

I continued to play at Westcott, I also started playing at funerals. The most bizarre was for Matt [name changed for privacy]. Matt was a bit of a rogue, but very likeable. His son gave a great eulogy, the drift of which was that Dad had been a good influence on the youth of the village. At this point, there was an audible stage whisper from the body of the church "have we come to the right funeral?" Rather too much laughter. Things then got even odder. It had rained all week, and the grave digger had not been able to complete his work. Alan went to check that all was in order, when there was a loud shout from the grave "I forgot my ladder and can't get out!" Matt would have enjoyed this.

Shortly after, I received an invitation to play once a month at St James Tunbridge Wells. This was an honour, as the organ was as big as a cathedral one. The Saturday before my Sunday debut, I thought I would go and test the organ. The church was locked so the verger had to come and let me in. When he had left, I remembered what Bach used to say when he faced a new organ, "let's see what this box of



whistles can do!". Then he pulled out all the stops. I did the same. There was a huge sound, and the whole building vibrated. The next day as I sat at the console ready to play, the irate vicar approached and said "yesterday the verger reported that the new organist was mad, and tried to blow the roof off the church. Please play quietly!" I never pulled out all the stops again.

Back in Westcott, I sometimes played for 3 services on a Sunday. Then Covid came. I resigned from St James, and Evensong at Westcott was scrapped. Now the family service has a band, but the organ is still played at the 8.30 communion service, to the satisfaction of the congregation.

I have really enjoyed playing the organ at Holy Trinity, and would like to thank the congregation for their appreciation and support.



#### RHS BUMBLEBEE SURVEY



#### Can you be a bumblebee spotter?

This spring the RHS are calling on gardeners to help them record bumblebees on flowers in gardens and parks. Bumblebees are a key group of wild pollinators, and like many pollinating insects, bumblebees face the challenges of habitat loss and climate change.



Bumblebees mostly overwinter in the UK as queens, which emerge from sheltered places as spring progresses. The emerging bees need flowers to provide nectar while the protein-rich pollen from flowers is fed to the developing larvae of the worker bumblebees.

More information is needed on which flowers do bumblebees use. To help find the answer, the RHS are hoping gardeners will become community scientists and help spot bumblebees on flowers this spring. To help capture this information, they are using a popular wildlife recording tool called iNaturalist. This can be downloaded as an app onto a smartphone and used to capture records when you are out

in your garden or local park, up to 31st May. Records can then be submitted to the 'Bumbles on Blooms' project within iNaturalist.



As an alternative, you can also add photos to the Bumbles on Blooms project via the iNaturalistUK website. You will need a minimum of one photo clearly showing the bumblebee on a flower, but ideally, take two photos from different angles of the bee on the flower, plus a third photo of just the flower it was on, particularly if you are unsure about the type of flower it is.



#### Plastics Inside – the hidden crisis

'In March 2022, scientists confirmed they had found microplastics in human blood for the first time'. This rather alarming fact is taken directly from a BBC article and you can be sure that, if these plastics are within us, then they are definitely in many other species that we share our planet with too. We all know the issue of plastic is huge – we have seen numerous images on the news and in social media, of plastics being washed up on beaches around the world and turning up in the bellies of starving birds, fish and mammals.



In 2014 a study concluded that there were 250,000 tons of floating plastic debris in the oceans and that, even then, this number was increasing. Not only is this impacting directly on wildlife, but these very same plastics have been shown to be connected to diseases in humans and in reductions in fertility rates in people around the world.

#### Micro and Nano plastics

The term microplastics refers to pieces of plastic which are smaller than 0.5mm in diameter, which is roughly equivalent to a grain of rice. While nano plastics

are far smaller, at just 100 nanometres or less. In December 2023, a published paper looked at the impact of micro and nano plastics, specifically on their impact on reproductive systems. They concluded that the plastic particles which enter our bodies via skin contact, inhalation, or ingestion, target reproductive systems by disturbing cell development. Indeed, another study looking at the trends of reproductive systems, analysed sperm counts in the 20th and 21st century. Their analysis showed that in 1973, sperm counts had fallen on average by 1.2% but post 2000, this rate of decline had increased by 2.6%. The researchers state that 'this world-wide [reproductive] decline is continuing in the 21st century at an accelerated pace'.

These studies clearly show that plastics are causing not only a fertility crisis, but they are also impacting us through other diseases. Studies show that plastics are increasing rates of diabetes, respiratory system issues, low birth rates, neuro toxicity and cancer, to name but a few. One study reported the link between Parkinson's disease and dementia, as a direct result of exposure to plastics. This 2023 study found that 'Nano plastics interact with a particular protein that is naturally found in the brain, creating changes linked to Parkinson's disease and some types of dementia'.

Our world is full of plastic, and it is

estimated that by the year 2050, plastic will be found in the digestive tract of



99% of all sea bird species! Mammals including us, are also at risk with approximately

63,000–430,000 tonnes of micro plastics, entering farmlands annually through sewage sludge applications.

#### What is in the plastic?

There are more than 10,000 chemicals identified as plastic additives and 2,400 have been classified as detrimental to marine and terrestrial eco systems. 1.000 of these chemicals are identified as endocrine disruptors which lead endocrine difficulties, including to insulin release and arowth and developmental abnormalities. Many of the chemicals within our systems are able to cross the blood brain barrier. leading to multiple issues in our health and reproduction. There are specific endocrine disrupting chemicals now found to have the ability to cross the placenta, from mother to child, resulting in infant abnormalities and low birth rates.

#### So where does it stop?

Plastic is a byproduct of the fossil fuel industry, with over 99% of plastic made from chemicals sourced from fossil fuels. In 2019 the production and incineration of plastic produced 850 million metric tons of greenhouse gases. It is estimated

that, if allowed to continue at this rate, this will rise to a staggering 2.8 billion metric tonnes by 2050! Since 1950, 90% of all the plastic produced has never been recycled. This is, in part, due to the difficulty in recycling mixed materials although other factors also play a role. The point is, that plastic is still being produced and if we are to halt the plastic problem in our world, we need to cut it off at the source. If your bath is overflowing and the plug is blocked,

you don't k e e p s c o o p i n g the water out with a bucket, you turn off the tap first!



We too must turn off the source of the plastic in the first instance. Big corporations must invest in innovative solutions to this problem and commit to reducing their reliance on fossil fuels. But we have a voice too and should demand better from these companies and support sustainable ways out of this crisis. Our planet deserves our support in this, we are in this together and need to strive for a plastic-free future for all our sakes.



#### FROM YOUR DISTRICT COUNCILLORS



The last few months have been quite a busy time at MVDC. As I am sure you are aware, there is an ongoing crisis in local government financing across the country, with many councils going bankrupt and introducing sky high council tax rates which impact residents and local businesses. However, we are pleased to state that MVDC is nowhere near this level, with our budget delivering £1.8 million worth of savings while maintaining services from waste management, playgrounds, holiday activities, planning and much more that I know residents in our village rely on.

The Council has also unpaused the Mole Valley local plan which designates housing and development sites in order to meet housing targets. The local plan should be implemented later this year and ensures a minimum 40% affordable homes in all development sites, with development being carbon neutral and mandating increases in biodiversity. In Westcott, the land at Mill Way House, Bramley House and Heathcrest (Policy DS63) has been allocated for 15 flats to be built. Further information on the local plan can be

found at futuremolevalley.org.

We have been busy with public works around the village, alongside Hazel Watson, our County Councillor: including fixing the kerb stones by the bus lay-by near UNUM. We have also installed a new handrail on the sloped path from Springfield Rd to Cradhurst Commons, which should make walking there much easier!



Finally, Westcott has received 2 further grants through CIL funding: £7,500 to replace a solar powered vehicle activated sign with an electric one and £2,600 for works at Westcott Village Hall, following a recent fire safety assessment.

As always, if you have any concerns or need help with anything, do not hesitate to email us and just before signing off, remember to mark May 2nd in your calendars; that's local government election day so no matter who you support, it's always important to get your voice heard and vote!
